In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus set out the code of conduct and moral standard expected of those who profess faith in Him. The 3 chapters, Matt 5-7, highlight the distinctive qualities and values that citizens of God's Kingdom are expected to live by.

Jesus emphasized that believers are to be different from the world in their conduct and behaviour, distinctive in their mindset, attitudes, relationships and priorities in life. He also expounded on what it means to trust and worship God whole-heartedly.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer said that renewal and revival of the Church will come only if all believers are to band together to pledge uncompromising allegiance to the Sermon on the Mount and to live by the standard Jesus set.

The course will look at the purpose of Jesus' teachings and the relevance of His moral expectations in this time and age. It will examine the distinction between true and false spirituality, Jesus' warnings against self-righteousness, the need to cultivate persevering trust in God, the secret of Christian joy and how to defeat temptation.
